

To Kill A Mockingbird Unit Test Study Guide



Part 1: 15 Multiple Choice Questions

Sample Question: The novel both starts and ends with the incident in which...

- (A) Scout is frightened by Boo Radley
- (B) Mrs. Dubose annoys Scout
- (C) Jem Breaks his arm
- (D) Atticus displays his heroic qualities

Correct answer: A. Explanation: The question states that the ending of the book comes full circle with the beginning (same event). If you do not remember the beginning, consult the ending. The book ends with Bob Ewell attacking Jem and Scout. Mr. Ewell's attack could have easily broke Jem's arm or had Atticus display his heroic qualities which narrows down the question to choices C and D. Since Atticus is inferred to be a humble person, the only choice left is choice C.

Part 2: True or False Questions

Note: If the answer is false, you will NOT have to make it true.

Examples:

Question	Answer
1 Atticus strongly discourages moral educations	
2 Bob Ewell attacked Jem and Scout on the unusually cold night of October 30 th	
3 Atticus stood up for Mrs. Robinson when she was being harassed by Bob Ewell	
4 Boo Radley fixed Jem's Pants	
5 Mrs. Dubose had sunflowers in her front yard	

Correct Answers: (1) False, (2) False, (3) False, (4) True, (5) False

Part 4: Quote Identification

1. "I know every last one of you's in there a-layin' on the floor! Now hear me, Bob Ewell: if I hear one more peep outa my girl Helen about not bein' able to walk this road I'll have you in jail before sundown!" Who said the quote? *Link Deas*

2. "Let's not let our imaginations run away with us, dear," she said. "Now you tell your father not to teach you any more. It's best to begin reading with a fresh mind. You tell him I'll take over from here and try to undo the damage-" Who said this quote? *Miss Caroline*

Part 5: 3 Character Development Questions

Format: Questions contain at least three adjectives describing a character in the novel.

Example: Cal can best be described as... (A) Honest (B) Wicked (C) Disciplinarian
Explain your answer.

Possible Answers: *Both Choice A and Choice C are correct.*

Choice A explanation: Cal is clearly an honest person. For example Cal is honest to the children when she tells them about how she has “dual personalities” in chapter 12.

Choice C explanation: In chapter 1, Cal is described as a disciplinarian. When Walter Cunningham ate dinner at the Finch house, Cal reprimanded Scout because her manners were improper.

Part 6: Literary Elements

Setting: Fictional town of Maycomb, Alabama in 1933-1935. Franklin D. Roosevelt was the US president at the time. Segregation was at peak times.

Themes: racism, good and evil, innocence

Mood: realistic

Symbolism: Mockingbirds (the innocent who were hurt by society), Boo Radley (symbolizes good)

Point of View: The narrator is scout looking back at the events from a unknown later date.
